We would like to wish all of our children and families a Happy New Year! We hope you had a wonderful Christmas holiday and are looking forward to being back at school and seeing what the new year brings!



PARENTS EVENING!

Parents evening will be held on Tuesday 23rd January 2024 from 3.15pm - 6.00pm. The booking system will be available on Monday 15th January 2024 for you to book your appointment. On Thursday 25th January 2024 parents and carers are invited to our drop-in sessions at 3pm where you can look at your child's books to see what they have been learning about in school. As always, if you have any questions, please speak to your child's class teacher.

ATTENDANCE

At Swain House Primary School we believe that good attendance and punctuality are key to your child making good progress at school. Our aim is that all children have attendance at 95% or above.

The information below shows how attendance can affect your child's future progression.

Above 96%: Less than 8 days absence a year (0 to 44 hours of learning lost)

Excellent attendance! These pupils will almost certainly get the best grades they can, leading to better prospects for the future. Pupils will also get into a habit of attending school which will help in the future.

95% - 95.9%: Less than 10 days absence a year (0 to 55 hours of learning lost)

These pupils are likely to achieve good grades and form a habit of attending school regularly, but are less likely to do as well as a child with attendance above 96%. Pupils who take a 2 week holiday every year can only achieve 95% attendance.

94.9% and lower to 90%: 10 to 19 days absence a year (55 to 105 hours of learning lost)

Pupils with attendance below 95% have attendance below the national average and they are at risk of missing key lessons in a sequence of lessons and may find it hard to keep up with their work. They may find this level of attendance, particularly if it is erratic, adversely affects their friendship groups as pupils play with other children when they are absent.

90% and lower: 19 or more days absence a year (at least 105 hours of learning lost)

The Government identifies pupils with attendance below 90% as "Persistent Absentees", and it will be almost impossible to keep up with work. Parents of pupils in this group could also face the possibility of legal action being taken by the Local Authority.

If your child is absent due to illness, school will ask for supporting documents. Some examples of evidence that could be used are: Prescriptions, Appointment Cards, Doctor's Notes, etc. Please ensure any routine appointments are made out of school hours. If this evidence is not supplied when your child returns after an illness or medical absence, your child's absence will be recorded as "unauthorised".

It is important to remember that the Headteacher is only allowed to authorise a leave of absence in exceptional circumstances. The Headteacher will decide what they believe is an exceptional circumstance, but a leave of absence for a holiday, a family occasion, or a visit to see family members is likely to be "unauthorised".

REMINDERS

We have had an increasing number of children coming to school with jewellery that is not included in our school policy. Please see the guidance below, if you have any questions please speak to your child's class teacher—Thank you

Jewellery

Pupils may not wear jewellery in school with the exception of one pair of stud earrings and a watch. Exemptions to the rules about jewellery may be made for items of specific religious significance. Requests for exceptions should be made in writing to the Headteacher or via email to office@swainhouse.bradford.sch.uk

We advise that pupils do not come to school with earrings in on the days that they have Physical Education for health and safety reasons. Watches will also need to be removed for these lessons. Please have a discussion with your child about jewellery being their personal responsibility and not that of the school.

Pupils may not wear false nails and make-up for school.

Pumps

Please ensure that your child has a pair of black pumps in school.

Application checklist

- Use the Bradford online system to apply if you live in the Bradford area
- List up to five schools, within or outside the Bradford area. Do not include private schools.
- Fill in and return supplementary information forms (SIF) to schools that require them, for example, faith (Catholic and Church of England) schools and Dixons Music Academy.
- If applying for priority due to medical or social reasons, ensure you do so at the time of application and ensure you provide supporting evidence from relevant professionals (see page 3).
- If you have moved recently or intend to do so, check the rules and what evidence we require as this will affect your application (page 4).
- Have you checked the latest school travel policy? For further details go to www.bradford.gov.uk/ schooltravelpolicy.
- Apply by the closing date, 15 January 2024.
