The impact of Sports Premium Funding (2015-2016)

Through the government sports grant, at Swain House Primary School, we are able to provide the following for our children:

- Wider sporting opportunities for all children introduced to new sports/activities such as ultimate
 Frisbee and tri-golf
- Specialised curriculum teaching in two year groups (Y4 and Y6)
- Specialised PE planning used in every year group
- Additional after school sports provided by sports coaches for all year groups (Y1-Y6)
- Every year group participated in a specialised sporting festival run by sport coaches
- Working closely with a number of sporting specialists
- Wide spread opportunities for children of all ages and year groups to attend out of school competitions
- All pupils (from Nursery to Year 6) take part in street dance sessions leading up to an end of term performance (Y1 to Y6)

• The uptake in extracurricular sporting activities has increased over the year and is similar in numbers to 2014-2015. Most after school clubs run at full capacity – multiskills for Y1, multiskills for Y2, gymnastics for Y3 and golf for Y4

- The enthusiasm for competition has certainly increased and Swain House is now in a position to make team 'selections' from a number of keen participants
- Teachers have reported that children are now fully engaged in PE lessons and enthusiastic about furthering their knowledge
- The enthusiasm during street dance sessions has increased with pupils working towards a performance
- Staff knowledge, skills and understanding of sports has increased due to training sessions to support the sport festivals provided by Sports UK
- Large number of pupils from KS2 (40 pupils) took part in the Junior Dance competition and performed in front of a large audience at Buttershaw School
- Pupils met famous sportsmen (the Brownlee brothers) at the Triathlon event to encourage participation in sport
- Our whole school attendance is 96.0% which matches last year's national figure
- Our whole school punctuality has improved again this year when compared to previous years
- Y6 have taken part in an international 'Well Being' survey funded by the University of Bradford. The results of this will be analysed when this has finished in the autumn term
- Play leaders have received training from Sports UK in the autumn term and have led games outside at playtimes and lunchtimes
- An overwhelming majority of pupils stated that schools helps them keep healthy in the pupil questionnaire July 2016 – 98%

Other information about leading healthy lifestyles (not funding by the Sports Premium)

- 98 KS2 pupils and 49 KS1 pupils have taken part in an after school football club this year
- The Life Caravan supports our work on healthy schools; children understand the importance of leading healthy lifestyles
- Every pupil in KS2 ran one mile for Sports Relief and Y6 pupils completed a sponsored run as part of their fund raising for the 'Hoody Project'
- Sports Day run by Sports UK, allowing all KS2 pupils to take part in an inter house competition, participating in eight different sporting events (standing long jump, javelin, relay race, target throw, triple jump, football dribble, skipping relay and egg and spoon race)

At Swain House Primary School, we aim to give pupils the opportunity to develop healthy, active lifestyles.

Actions for next year:

- Invite parents to the street dance performances
- Two year groups to participate in swimming lessons so more pupils reach the expected standard
