BRITISH SIGN LANGUAGE WEEK 2025!

We had a busy morning on Tuesday, 11th March, with a visit from the Bradford City of Culture 2025 Social Media Team! They came to follow Sign Language Week 2025 and to explore this year's theme: "More than a language – culture, community, and belonging."

These three words are imperative to our Local Authority Led Resourced Provision (RP) at Swain House Primary School, where British Sign Language (BSL) and English are equally valued. This ensures that our Deaf children develop strong language skills and a positive sense of identity.

Our Deaf children have access to both Deaf and hearing staff who are all highly competent in BSL. This creates a culturally rich learning environment with direct teaching in both languages. As a result, Deaf children at Swain House Resourced Provision genuinely feel a sense of belonging!







Monday 17th March was the start of Sign Language Week 2025 and all the children came in dressed in blue and yellow. The RP children went to the Early Years classes and carried out a session, teaching the younger children the signs for colours. The whole school joined in the colour theme and the dinner hall was decorated to celebrate the Sign Language Week.


The RP children led a whole school assembly and they enjoyed teaching the children signs for all the different types of transport. They all had an amazing time showing the children how to sign and use the correct handshapes alongside using facial expressions to make the whole experience fun for the learners. Our children embraced being Deaf and felt proud to share BSL with their hearing peers.

They showed such confidence, and all the RP staff were extremely proud of them!





Look at the amazing art work that was created by the Resourced Provision children to share that they are proud to be Deaf and continuing the theme for Sign Language week. They have used colours from the Deaf flag, turquoise to represent the Deaf community and Sign Language, yellow to represent light and life and dark blue to symbolise planet Earth and humanity.

Bradford SENDIASS

Bradford SENDIASS is for parents and carers of children and young people (0-25) with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) in the Bradford area - and for their children too.



The staff help parents and children to work together with schools and the local authority so that they have a good understanding of what support is



needed and to make sure that it is put in place. We can also offer IASS around health and social care needs in relation to SEND.

Holiday Activities and Food

Children on free school meals are eligible for a free place at a HAF holiday club during the Easter, sum-



mer and Christmas school holidays. HAF clubs provide free, fun activities and a healthy meal for eligible children, including children with SEND or additional needs.

Places are limited on the clubs so please book early to avoid missing out. Bookings are now open for the Easter holiday.

If your child is not on benefits-related free school meals, but has special educational needs or disabilities (SEND), then you will need to contact a club directly to ask if they have places available.


How to do it


