

Swain House Primary School
PE and Sports Grant for Academic Year 2014/15

Purpose of Funding (taken from DfE website)

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding might include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers when teaching PE
- supporting and engaging the least active children through new or additional Change4Life clubs
- paying for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE and sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing pupils' participation in the School Games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE and sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sports clubs and holiday clubs
- pooling the additional funding with that of other local schools

Funding Allocation for Swain House

Funding will be £8000 per school + £5 per pupil in years 1-6 and those age 5 in Reception, as recorded in the January 2015 Census.

For our school the funding in 2014-2015 was £8000 + (£5 x 395 pupils = £1975) = **£9975**

Staff attended courses linked to sports agreed: multi-sports, golf and gymnastics. After school clubs to run half termly to support the competitions. Enter the Junior Dance competition. Have inter-school competitions termly for all year groups.	£1658

To increase to number of pupils taking part in dance and dance performance	Firefly Dance to deliver dance lessons to all pupils from Nursery to Y6 and present their work to the rest of school in an assembly each term.	£7600

Impact:

- PE observations of the Sports UK coach were good or better with pupils showing high quality outcomes, particularly in gymnastics
- Teachers' planning showed differentiation after using dedicated Sports UK planning
- Responses from the staff questionnaire showed that the combination of the new planning and support from the coach has led to greater confidence for teachers and improved outcomes for children
- All pupils chosen for festivals attended after school sports clubs and were chosen to increase the opportunity or were not likely to participate in out of school activities
- Staff attended training to match needs and confidence is higher in the delivery and teaching of PE
- School has taken part in some inter-school competitions
- Clubs ran for each half term and were well attended in each year group
- Teams were entered the Junior Dance competition and were commended for their creativity
- The school council reviewed clubs in school and asked pupils for their opinions and suggestions – wider range of activities was then run with some new coaches
- A pupil survey showed increased happiness with playtimes and activities at lunch and after school
- This year, the highest number of pupils attained the national curriculum standard and personal safety in swimming
- Twenty three Y4 pupils who had not been swimming before, or who were afraid of swimming, went for six hours of swimming lessons
