



We started the school year with lots of snow. We did have many issues for transport and the snowy, icy weather. However, we were glad once the children could get back to school to start their learning.

Zones of Regulations

The children in the RP have been talking and learning about their emotions. They are learning to express how they feel and how they can make small changes to improve how they are feeling. They all have a turn to go to the front and pick an emotion and then explain why they feel like that. They all join in to see how they can support that feeling and it helps them all to learn and understand.





We had a workshop for the parents so they could understand how Zones of Regulation work with children and how they can help their children at home to deal with emotions on a daily basis. It was a great experience to see how small things can trigger emotions and leave a person feeling low, sad or tired.
